



Members and Visitors Responsibilities To Health and Safety

Members and visitors also have a responsibility in relation to Health and Safety and have an obligation to:

- Cooperate with the Centre to maintain a safe environment.
- Take reasonable care for their own safety and that of others who may be affected by their actions in the Scout centre premises.
- Report without delay any potential hazards or defects in physical structure, equipment, or work systems that might endanger the health and safety of any person.
- Report without delay any accidents or dangerous occurrences.
- Use any personal protective equipment or appliances provided in the interests of safety.
- Ensure that good housekeeping practices are maintained and in particular that fire exit routes are kept clear and that fire points are not obstructed;
- Ensure that they make themselves familiar with the emergency plans and procedures in place and that they participate in any practice drills associated with these procedures.
- Ensure that they fully understand the safety policy and their own responsibilities within it.
- Ensure that they are aware of and follow the procedures as set out in Scouting Irelands Code of Good Practice.
